# <u>ST. PAUL'S UNITED CHURCH</u> FALL/ WINTER NEWSLETTER 2015/16

It has come to our attention that we may not have been keeping our congregation members informed as to what our church is doing in the community.

Our regular Newsletter is mailed to every household on our Congregational Roll and a monthly email with Coming Events keeps those that have given us their e-mail addresses updated with what is happening in and around St. Paul's. If we don't have your e-mail address and you would like to be a part of this notification process please send it to <u>stpaulsu@sasktel.net</u> and we can add you to our list. We need to find more comprehensive ways of communicating with parishioners who do not regularly attend services. We fully understand people's reluctance to answer a request for support if you do not know who or what will be the recipient of your contribution.

St. Paul's has provided for members and non-members **funerals.** Our Interim Minister, Rev. Sharon Ferguson-Hood, meets with the families prior to the service and provides After-Care, if requested. St. Paul's is the church that people with no church affiliation come to for their loved ones final Celebration of Life which we are happy to do.

**Tisdale and Area Community Action Co-operative Ltd**. uses our lower hall/kitchen area plus a room in the lower level for their Community Kitchens program twice a week. They organize the Good Food Box Program from there too.

**NEECIP Wee Ones Workshops** are held once a week in the lower hall.

The Highland Dance Group is using our lower hall for practices.

The Tisdale Men's Choir practices weekly in the sanctuary.

**The Tisdale Arts Council** meets in the Runicman Room during the winter months. These are all worthwhile groups and in need of space, support and are subsidized by St. Paul's congregation.

**North East Women's Shelter in Melfort** is an ongoing project for us with donations of bedding, toys, and personal items etc.

A financial donation was made to the surviving child of the murdered Goslyn family this summer.

Congregation members donate to **The United Church Mission and Service Fund** which helps people in many provinces in Canada as well as around the world. **We are holding a Fundraiser on Nov. 7<sup>th</sup>, 2015 to assist Nepal following the Earthquake there.** 

**Food/Cash donations for the Tisdale Food Bank** are collected each month. Volunteers from our congregation help on rotation at the Food Bank and also with the **Salvation Army Kettle** at Christmas time.

#### Our donations were able to help supply some backpacks for local school children this fall.

We give yearly financial support to **St. Andrew's College** which educates people for ministry in our congregations.

**Bridging Waters Youth Group (Nipawin Pastoral Charge) travelled to Mexico where they helped build a House for Humanity and we gave a donation to help them with their expenses.** Some of the group came to Tisdale afterwards to lead a service here at St. Paul's and tell us about their experiences. They brought an evergreen tree for us to plant here in Tisdale.

Each year we have had a Camping Sunday service, the proceeds from the "Tuck Shop" are sent to our **United Church Camp Tapawingo at Candle Lake.** 

5 couples were married this year in St. Paul's. (Some were non-members)

The UCW (United Church Women) hold 2 Rummage Sales each year with help from the general congregation members. (Over \$5,000 was realized from the 2 Sales this year). They also donate to the Tisdale Dialysis Unit, Camp Tapawingo, Calling Lakes Centre, St. Andrew's College and Bursary, North East Outreach & Support Services, Tisdale and Area Community Action Cooperative Ltd. and North East Early Childhood as well as numerous other projects.

**The Fall Supper** is another event that requires a big group of dedicated people to organize and put on. Two years ago we had no one come forward to organize the Fall Supper. We are very thankful to those that have come forward to do it this year!!

Members of our congregation faithfully visit shut-ins and Nursing Home Residents and our minister visits at the Hospital when requested.

As is the case with many small rural churches, St. Paul's struggles with declining membership, demographic aging and reduced financial contributions. Our hope is to engage a full time minister in the coming year that would be part of our community and provide continuity to our future work. The possibility of closure is very real which would be a loss not only for our congregation members but also for Tisdale Community.

# From Sharon's Desk Sept. 2015

Fall is here, a beautiful season on the prairie, today the sun is warm and a warm wind blows. It is a good day for harvest.

I have enjoyed my time with you, and there is about eight months left of our two year interim. We have a workshop coming up on October 24<sup>th</sup> regarding how to manage conflict that grows out of conversation around change, or any other church topic that might be controversial. We will be involved in a Joint Needs Assessment (JNA), and we have a committee in place to do that work.
